PALMS for PALM SUNDAY

Parishioners Mrs. Marianna and Mr. Julian Wolanin are kindly making and donating beautiful Polish Palm Sunday Palms for sale for the good of our church.

Since palm trees do not grow in Poland, people have created "palms" with what is native to the country. Pussy willows, one of the first bushes to bloom, are often used, decorated with ribbons, greenery, dried grasses, and flowers, flowers made from paper, etc. depending on regional customs and the maker's creativity. Once blessed, the palm is kept in a prominent place at home, near a holy picture or crucifix, and also on the table on Easter Sunday next to an image of the Risen Lamb, which graces the center of the table of blessed food shared in the breaking of the fast following Mass.
