

Transfiguration Parish Alumni

Tuesday, October 22nd, Feast of John Paul II, Pope

Karol Józef Wojtyła was born on May 18, 1920, in Wadowice, Poland. He was ordained in 1946, became the bishop in 1958, and became the archbishop of Krakow in 1964. He was made a cardinal

by Pope Paul VI in 1967, and in 1978 became the first non-Italian Pope in more than 400 years. He was a vocal advocate for human rights and used his influence to effect political change. He was Pope for 27 years from 1978 to 2005 making him the second longest-serving Pope in modern history after Pope Pius IX.
