Ring the Bells

The primary purpose of ringing the church bells in today’s world times is to remind worshippers to gather for a church service about to begin. In Christianity, the bell is said to represent the “voice of God”. Traditionally, they are used to not only call worshippers to the church for a communal service, but also to announce times of daily prayer.



Before modern communications, church bells were a common way to call the community together for all purposes, both sacred and secular.

Here at Corpus Christi Church we own three bells. The bell of Saint Anthony (1,500 lbs.) is our largest bell, the bell of Saint Francis (1,000 lbs.) and the smallest of Saint Hyacinth (750 lbs.) One of our loyal parishioners, Martin Ederer maintains our bells. We thank him for his efforts in our behalf.

We are offering to anyone interested, a special opportunity to ring one of our tree bells, and call our parishioners to Mass. This happens 5 minutes before Mass. Help for Beirut

Bishop Scharfenberger has approved parishes in the Diocese of Buffalo to assist the Archdiocese of Beirut as they deal with the aftermath of the

This is a country already struggling with pandemic and crushed by economic collapse. As Catholics we cannot ignore the situation.

Parishes and parishioners are struggling in so many ways. But we all must not forget about the larger church and world and be willing help. Please make a sacrificial donation.
