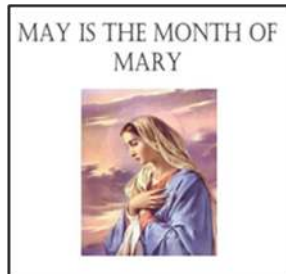

May the Month of the Blessed Virgin Mary



The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which

Catholics in every part of the world to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

May is such a beautiful month. The whole month is dedicated to our Blessed Lady, Mother of God. The pious practice of honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary during the entire month of May has been especially recommended by many Popes.

Some devotions to Mother Mary for the Month of May

1. Recite the Regina Coeli (during the Paschal Season) or Angelus (other days of the year) daily.
2. Recite the Rosary daily as a family. Remember to meditate on each mystery and to pray with all your heart and mind.
3. Recite the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary also known as the Litany of Loreto.
4. Celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima on May 13th. You can pray a Novena to Our Lady of Fatima in preparation for her Feast.
5. Visit a Marian Shrine as a pilgrimage.
6. Prepare a Marian Altar in your home for the "Queen of May" with pictures/statues of Mother Mary and many flowers.

May 13th, Our Lady of Fatima

May 13 is the anniversary of the apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima in Portugal in 1917. She appeared six times to Lucia, 9, and her cousins Francisco, 8, and his sister Jacinta, 6, between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917.
