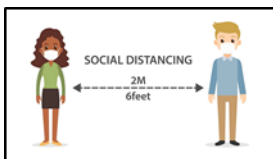

**Happy 123rd Anniversary Corpus Christi Church  
Bishop Quigley approved its formation under the title  
of Corpus Christi on April 22, 1898.**



Buffalo, NY was one of the industrial cities which by the late 1800s had acquired a large Polish population.

A number of Polish parishes had begun during this time in Buffalo such as: St. Stanislaus, St. Adalbert, St. Casimir, St. John Kanty, and a few others. Despite the formation of these parishes they proved to be inadequate to meet the needs of the growing Polish population in the area. In addition, the diocese had run out of Polish priests so they could not start another Polish Parish. At the request of the Bishop, Father Hyacinth Fudzinski of the Order of Friars Minor Conventual purchased 29 lots and 10 houses on Clark Street to build another parish to minister to the needs of the Polish people. Bishop James E. Quigley approved its formation under the title of Corpus Christi on April 22, 1898.

**GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY:** Good Shepherd Sunday is celebrated on Sunday, April 25, 2021. On this day, Jesus speaks to us as the Good Shepherd calling His flock to actively follow Him. It is a call to discipleship, and Father Michał Czyżewski, OSPPE, pastor, points out that “its significance resides in the fact that it is the perfect time to pray for our priests, bishops, the pope, and all those who shepherd the Lord’s flock. We need to ask the Holy Spirit to inspire those in authority and to help them lead our faithful to become active participants and witnesses to Christ’s everlasting love.” This Sunday is also known as Vocations Sunday. Father Michał urges everyone to pray for vocations to the



priesthood and to religious life. Jesus, as the good shepherd, calls His sheep by name, and the sheep recognize His voice and follow Him.
