

Door opener for the handicapped



To accommodate our friends and parishioners experiencing a handicap, or are wheelchair bound, we would like to install an electronic door opener on the front, south side entrance door that

already has the handicap ramp. Because Corpus Christi Church is an historic landmark, the 2 inch wood doors would NOT be replaced because of our landmark status and the opener would be responsible to open and close this heavy weight door at a cost of \$5,650. This would include necessary electrical work that also needs to be done to prepare for the installation of the openers.

As in the past, we are looking to you and your family for your generous donation that will help offset the major cost of this electrical door opener. You and your family will be remembered during our Holy Mass celebrating 9-day Novena to Our Lady of Czestochowa in August, 2021. Ringing the Bells

The primary purpose of ringing the church bells in today's world times is to remind worshippers to gather for a church service about to begin. In Christianity, the bell is said to represent the "voice of God". Traditionally, they are used to not



only call worshippers to the church for a communal service, but also to announce times of daily prayer.

Before modern communications, church bells were a c ommon way to call the community together for all purposes, both sacred and secular.

Here at Corpus Christi Church we own three bells. The bell of Saint Anthony (1,500 lbs.) is our largest bell, the bell of Saint Francis (1,000 lbs.) and the smallest of Saint Hyacinth (750 lbs.) One of our loyal parishioners, Martin Ederer maintains our bells. We thank him for his efforts in our behalf.

We are offering to anyone interested, a special opportunity to ring one of our tree bells, and call our parishioners to Mass. This happens 5 minutes before Mass. So if you are able to climb 2 flights of steps and would like to pull on the ropes, and become a members of our Bell Club, please see one of our ushers, or call the office at 716-896-1050
