Synod Report to the United States Catholic

Below are a few of the issues reviewed:

- Expressions of the centrality of and appreciation for the real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and how to reach people with this reality.
- Challenges related to dissemination of Catholic Social Teaching.
- A desire for “Catholic Identity” – a yearning for help in living a life by Catholic ethics and principles.
- The need for the Church Hierarchy to form a united front.
- Need for “adult formation” – all age groups - on Church teachings, Scripture, Catechism of the Catholic Church.
- Challenges in getting parishes to feel themselves connected to the One Church.
- Concerns parishioners have that their parish will lose its character if joined to other parishes and “forced” to coordinate activities across parish lines.
- Issues on how some parishioners view Church moral authority as per the aftereffects of the abuse scandal.
- Lack of clarity on the understanding of spending at both the diocesan and local parish levels.
- Perspective of African American and Hispanic parish communities situated within the city limits, as far as feeling engaged with the diocese.
- Geographic perspective – parishioners in rural areas, as far as feeling engaged with the diocese.
- Challenges in becoming a more welcoming Church without losing what it fundamentally means to be Catholic.
- Gratitude and a desire to form stronger relationships with our priests.
- Need to reach out and bring people back to the pews.
- Need for parishes to have social gatherings through prayer groups, bible study groups, potlucks, to build relationships – “Need more friend raisers, not fund raisers”.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha

This Thursday, July 14, is the Feast Day of Kateri Tekakwitha. Saint Kateri was born in 1656 to a Mohawk chief and a Christian Algonquin woman who had been captured in a raid and assimilated into the Mohawk people. She was born in Ossernenon, on the south side of the Mohawk River near present day Auriesville, **New York**.

When she was four years old, a smallpox outbreak ravaged her village. Her parents and brother died, and Kateri herself was left with a scarred face and permanently darkened vision. Her Mohawk given name, Tekakwitha, means “she who bumps into things,” likely in reference to her poor eyesight. (from katerishrine.org)
