First Friday Devotion

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received private revelations from Jesus between the years 1673 and 1675. In these revelations Christ showed Margaret Mary the burning love He has in His Heart for all mankind. "The heart," he told her, "That is so little loved in return." Jesus requested that we show our love for Him by spending time with Him and receiving Holy Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months.

There is a window in Corpus Christi Church depicting Jesus "opening his robe and presenting His Sacred Heart. The image represents both Christ's mortality and divinity. The heart symbolizes his humanity, that he was a man of flesh and blood. The crown of thorns and cross signify the suffering and crucifixion. The flames bursting from the heart show Jesus' passion for mankind. The aura surrounding the image demonstrates the divinity of Jesus. The three stars above and to the left and right of Jesus represent the Holy Trinity" from The Stained Glass of Corpus Christi by Gregory L. Witul

Sunday, August 14, 2022

There will be **Blessing of the Herbs and Flowers** after the 9:30 **Sunday Mass** at Corpus Christi on **August 14**, a tradition carried on since the Middle Ages. In the Polish tradition, we refer to it as *Matki Boskiej Zielnej or Our Lady of the Herbs!*

In the past, wild flowers and herbs were brought to Church and blessed on the Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady.

Tradition tells us that many of our flowers and herbs were associated with Our Lady. The Violet, a low growing plant, is often referred to Our Lady's Humility and her Modesty. The story is told that the Violet blossomed when Our Blessed Mother said to the Archangel Gabriel, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord"!

The pious legend of the Marigold, or "Mary's Gold" tells us that when the Holy Family was fleeing into Egypt to save the Christ Child, the family was accosted by robbers. When they searched Mary's belongings for coins, they found these little yellow blossoms. So in medieval times, the poor who had no coins would lay "Mary's Gold" to show their love for their Mother at the feet of Our Lady.

The Lily-of-the-Valley resembles the tears that fell from the eyes of Our Mother as she stood at the Foot of the Cross.

The Iris has the shape of a sword, The Sword of Sorrow, which pierced our Dear Mother's heart. And we can't fail to mention, The Rose! The rose is considered the queen of all flowers, and Mary is the Queen of Angels, the Queen of Saints, the Queen of Heaven, the Queen of Earth, and the Queen of our Hearts!

Please bring your home grown or store bought flowers and herbs to Church next Sunday to have Father bless them!

Holocaust Remembrance

The 12 noon Mass at St. Stanislaus Church on Sunday, August 14, will also commemorate the death of St. Maximilian Kolbe. On August 14, 1941 the day before the Church was to celebrate the Assumption of his beloved Immaculata, Father Maximilian was put to death by a lethal injection of carbolic acid. He laid down his life in the death camp of Auschwitz, Poland, so that another prisoner's life might be spared. St. Maximilian, please pray for us!
