**Our Lady of Sorrows**

The Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15.

First Sorrow: *The Prophecy of Simeon*

“and you yourself a sword shall pierce” (Luke 2:35)  
Mary in her obedience to the Mosaic Law takes Jesus to the Temple forty days after his birth for the purification ceremony. At this time, Simeon spoke the above words to Mary who “pondered them in her heart.”

Second Sorrow: *The Flight into Egypt*

“The angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, ‘Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him.’” (Matt 2:13) The fear that must have gripped a Mother's heart knowing that someone was seeking her son and wanting to destroy Him. Joseph and Mary had to take their Child and flee in haste.

Third Sorrow: *Search for the Child in Jerusalem*

“After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, ‘Son, why have you don't this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety.’” (Luke 2:46, 48)

Fourth Sorrow: *Mary Meets Jesus on His Way to the Cross*

“And carrying the cross himself...” (John 19:17).

“A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him” (Luke 23:27).

Mary witnesses the pure, virginal body of her dearly beloved Son, which is lacerated and bleeding from the scourging, being pushed and pulled along under the weight of the Cross.

Fifth Sorrow: *Mary Stands at the Foot of the Cross*

“Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his Mother, ‘Woman, behold, your son.’ Then he said to the disciple, ‘Behold, your mother.’ And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.”

(John 19:25-27).

Sixth Sorrow: *Crucifixion and Descent from the Cross*

“After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove the body of Jesus. And Pilate permitted it. So, he came and took his body.” (John 19:38).

After Jesus is taken from the Cross, Mary, His Mother, holds His dead, lifeless body in her arms. What Mother's heart would not be breaking as she holds her dead child in her arms?

Seventh Sorrow: *The Burial of Jesus*

“The women who had come from Galilee with him followed behind, and when they had seen the tomb and the way in which his body was laid in it, they returned and prepared spices and perfumed oils.” (Luke 23:55-56)
