November 1 ALL SAINTS DAY

All Saints Day, November 1, is a Holy Day of Obligation. **Father Mariusz** will celebrate Mass at **6:00 pm** at **Corpus Christi** in the Main Church. There will be **NO 8:45 am Mass.**

Father will also be celebrating Mass at **Saint Stanislaus** on November 1, All Saints Day, at **8:00 am in English** and at **6:00 pm in Polish.**

November 2 All Souls Day

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. There will be **8:45 am Mass in the Chapel.**

The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire. (1 Cor. 3:15; 1 Pet 1:7) This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: “Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead that they might be delivered from their sin. From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead. (From the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1031 & 1032)

First Thursday Adoration

Thursday, **November 4** Father Mariusz will lead us in Eucharistic Adoration in the **Chapel** from **6:00 to 9:00 pm**. During this time when many prayers are needed for the upcoming election/elections, for the suffering souls in Purgatory (the month set aside to commemorate all the faithful departed), and in Thanksgiving (Nov. 24) for all our Blessings and Graces received, this is a wonderful opportunity to come before Our Lord present in the Eucharist and spend time in Loving Him. First Friday Devotion

Morning Mass in the **Chapel** at **8:45 am**, November 5, 2022. **“Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself in order to testify to its love! And in return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude, by their irreverence and sacrilege, and by the coldness and contempt they have for Me in this Sacrament of Love...”**

...I feel this more than all that I suffered during My Passion. If only they would make Me some return for My Love...”

From the Revelations of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

Our Lord longs to find special expressions of our love for Him on the **First Friday of each month**. Your fervent Holy Communion, as a special act of reparation and love to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, will greatly console Our Lord for the ingratitude and outrages that He endures for our sake in the Blessed Sacrament!

First Saturday Devotion

Morning Mass in the **Chapel** at **11:30 am**, November 6, 2022.

Our Blessed Lady promised to Sister Lucia, one of the seers at Fatima, on December 10, 1925:

“Look my daughter, at my Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console me and announce in my name that I promise to assist at the moment at death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Me.”

On February 15, 1926, the Child Jesus to Sr. Lucia concerning the devotion of the consecutive Five First Saturdays:

“It is true, my daughter, that many souls begin the First Saturdays, but few finish them, and those who do complete them do so in order to receive the graces that are promised thereby. It would please me more if they did Five with fervor and with the intention of making reparation to the Heart of your heavenly Mother, than if they did Fifteen, in a tepid and indifferent manner...”

Collection for the Military Services

On **November 6, 2022**, Corpus Christi will have a second collection for our Military Services, mainly young Catholics serving in the military and from all dioceses in the United States. The monies collected will be sent to Rev. Timothy P. Broglio, Archbishop of the Military Services. “We need to support the life of faith of the men and women as they courageously work to protect and defend our well-being and security”. This collection is only taken once every three years!

The March will arrive at the Baltimore Marriott Waterfront at 12:30 pm where the U. S.
