The Most Holy Name of Jesus Tuesday, January 3

“God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth”

(Philippians 2:9-10)

One of the greatest promoters of devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus was a Franciscan priest, St. Bernardine of Siena. Below is a brief prayer composed by St. Bernardine of Siena honoring the name of Jesus, placing oneself under His most watchful care.

“Jesus, Name full of glory, grace, love and strength! You are the refuge of those who repent, our banner of warfare in this life, the medicine of souls, the comfort of those who mourn, the delight of those who believe, the light of those who preach the

true faith, the wages of those who toil, the healing of the sick. To you our devotion aspires; by you our prayers are received; we delight in contemplating you. O Name of Jesus, you who are the glory of all the saints for eternity. Amen.

Chalking of the Doors

The Chalking of the Doors is a tradition related to the Epiphany (also known as Twelfth Night, *Theophany*, or Three Kings Day). On the Feast of the Epiphany we mark above the entrance to our home with chalk. Processing from door to door while singing songs, praying for the Lord’s blessing on the house and for all who might enter along with burning incense and sprinkling holy water heightens our awareness of what is being done. We are dedicating our year to God from its very onset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work, or visit. The letters in the center stand for the initials of the three Magi who came to visit Jesus: Casper, Malchior, and Balthazar.

After Mass, you can come forward and there will be baskets on the alter with incense and chalk to mark the entrance ways to your home.
