The following dogmas concerning Our Blessed Mother come from the Book:

Meet Your Mother,

A Brief Introduction to Mary

Theotokos

The Council of Ephesus in 431 solemnly declared Mary as the “Mother of God.”

Mary’s divine motherhood becomes the first Marian dogma, the first solemnly defined truth about Mary in the history of the Church.

Mary gave birth to Jesus Christ who truly is God.

Perpetual Virginity

The second dogma concerning Mary is her *threefold virginity*. The historical setting for this Marian proclamation was the First Lateran Council in 649, where Pope Martin I proclaimed Mary as being virginal in three keyways:

- (1) *before* the birth of Jesus,
- (2) *during* the birth of Jesus,
- (3) *after* the birth of Jesus.

Mary was a virgin *before the birth of Jesus*. In the fulfillment of the prophecy given by the Old Testament prophet Isaiah: “Behold, a virgin will conceive and bear a son and his name shall be called Emmanuel.” (Is 7:14) God the Son was conceived in the womb of Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Mary’s virginity remains intact *during the birth of Jesus*. The Fathers of the Church used this beautiful image: As light passes through glass without harming the glass, so, too, at the appointed time, *Jesus left the womb of Mary in a miraculous manner without violation to Mary’s physical virginity*. Because Mary was immaculately conceived and free from Original Sin and its effects, Mary could not suffer labor pains in giving birth, since labor pains are an effect of the fall of Adam and Eve. (Genesis 3:16).

The third aspect of Mary’s virginity is her virginity *after the birth of Jesus*. This aspect teaches that Mary never had relations with Joseph nor did she have other children besides Jesus. The Church Fathers saw in Mary’s response to the angel Gabriel (“How can this be, since I know not man”) refers to a permanent commitment of Mary’s physical virginity being an outward sign of her perfect interior virginity.

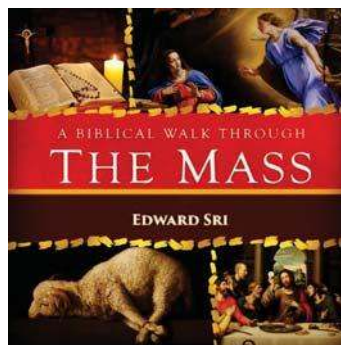

What are Czestochowa plaques?

Located in the vestibule of our church in a lovely chapel dedicated to the miraculous icon of the Black Madonna, you will notice that the walls are lined with name plaques.

Are the plaques only for the deceased?

Most of the names are of the deceased, although there are also some people who are living, so as to participate in the spiritual benefits of the chapel while still in this world. Both the deceased and the living can be enrolled.

What are the spiritual benefits of enrollment?

A monthly Mass on the first Saturday of every month is offered at 4 pm for the intention of all those enrolled in the OLC chapel. This is certainly a beautiful way for someone to remember a deceased loved one or a person that you would like to have the spiritual benefits of a monthly Mass for their intention.

What is the procedure for enrolling?

Simply contact the rectory office with the name (or names) you would like placed on the plaque. The name of the donor may also appear. The offering is \$250 for each plaque.

How will we know that a name has been added?

We will print the name (or names) in the parish bulletin every time that someone is enrolled.



WESOŁYCH SWIAT BOZEGO NARODZENIA! (MERRY CHRISTMAS!)

A few months ago, I was unpacking my 5-year-old's overnight bag after a sleepover at his cousin's house. Inside, I came across a small plastic bag containing a broken piece of a flat wafer-like substance. I studied it, and on it was a simple imprinted image of the Holy Family. I asked my son what it was. He lifted his hands up and said with his signature lisp, "This Polish Chrishmath bread, Mom!" His response was so matter-of-fact – as if I should already have a perfect understanding of what he was talking about. But in reality, I had no idea.

In a moment of bizarre coincidence, a week later, I received an email from the editorial director of FAITH suggesting that I write about the oplatki Polish Christmas tradition. I had never heard of it, so I did some research online. A bunch of photos of that same flat wafer with imprinted images of the Nativity popped up! I then had a reference as to what was in my son's bag. An oplatek!

Oplatki (plural) are thin wafers stamped with a Christmas scene, and are part of a beautiful tradition that dates back many centuries in Poland. A priest blesses the oplatki and he or another religious member then distributes them to families to recall the eucharistic presence of Jesus at Mass. The families return home with them, carrying a blessed reminder of the meaning of the Christmas season.

The customary practice varies slightly from family to family, but it commonly begins with the father or eldest member of the family taking the oplatek and breaking a large piece off to give to his wife. He may share what he is thankful for, wish her a blessing or even ask for forgiveness. She breaks a piece off and reciprocates with a sentiment or blessing for her husband. Then each family member or loved one, oldest to youngest, continues with the breaking of the unleavened bread and sharing their Christmas wishes and blessings for each other. When the ritual is finished, everyone sits down for a simple meal before the midnight Mass.

This beautiful tradition is still popular today throughout Eastern Europe, and even here in the United States amongst families of Polish descent. I just learned that many parishes here in our area provide oplatki Christmas wafers to parishioners, which is where my brother-in-law gets them for his family. Being Polish, he grew up practicing the beautiful tradition of the breaking of the bread, and now shares the custom with his own family. As for the remaining wafers, those are used by his children to "play Mass" at home. Hence, the leftover broken piece my sister-in-law placed in my 5-year-old's bag at the end of his sleepover with his cousins.

I am so grateful that this entire tradition was revealed to me recently, as I was not previously familiar with it. But it is an enduring custom and, though I am not Polish, I am inclined to adopt the tradition for my own family!

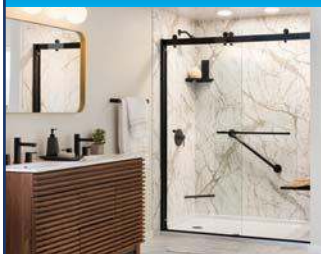
