The Church celebrates
Our Lady of Lourdes
on February 11th,
the day the Blessed Mother
first appeared to Bernadette Soubirous.

It was on a cold winter day in the south of France when a young girl named Bernadette was out gathering wood with her siblings. She was surprised by a visit from above.

I came back towards the grotto and started taking off my stockings. I had hardly taken off the first stocking when I heard a sound like a gust of wind. Then I turned my head towards the meadow. I saw the trees quite still: I went on taking off my stockings. I heard the same sound again. As I raised my head to look at the grotto, I saw a lady dressed in white, wearing a white dress, a blue girdle (sash) and a yellow rose on each foot, the same color as the chain of her rosary; the beads of the rosary were white...From the niche, or rather the dark alcove behind it, came a dazzling light.

This beautiful woman seen in the alcove came to share messages of love, hope, prayer and penance. When our Blessed Mother appeared the 8th out of 18 times, she said to Bernadette, "Penance! Penance! Penance! Pray to God for sinners."

Let us take to heart the words of Our Mother and plan now what penance (an act of self-mortification or devotion performed voluntarily to show sorrow for a sin or wrongdoing) we will choose for our Lenten observance.

Defining Fast & Abstinence

Fast – obligation to fast is from the age of 18 until the beginning of their 60th year. A person may eat **one full meal** and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal. This requirement is for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence – obligation to refrain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

Valentine was a bishop in Rome when Emperor Claudius II made it illegal for young people to marry, believing it made the men worse soldiers. Valentine disobeyed the decree, and secretly performed marriage ceremonies for young couples. When he was discovered, Valentine was arrested and executed. Saint Valentine gave his life for the sake of marriage, even though he himself could never marry. He understood the sacred bond of marriage as a sacrament that joins two persons into one flesh.
